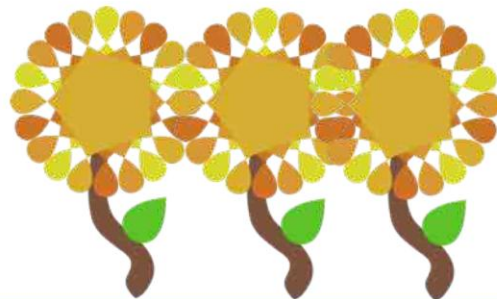

A Peek At Our Week

We have had another fabulous week of learning! Our students are eager, excited learners!

Reading: Our guided reading groups began this week. We have focused on identifying characters, setting, and retelling the story.

Math: In guided math groups our first graders worked on finding partners of 7, 8, and 9 by creating number bonds, number expressions, and equations. Our vocabulary focus this week was "addend." Our second graders worked on adding and subtracting single digit numbers of multiples of 10 by composing and decomposing numbers. Each week we work on Moby Max Tuesday through Friday, and our students are being challenged to stretch their math knowledge. They really enjoy the program.

Social Studies: This week we had the privilege of meeting Officer Rebecca Gunter. Officer Gunter works with the Mount Airy Police Department, and she is the daughter of Janet Gunter, our cafeteria manager. Ms. Wild's and Mrs. Goodson's classes joined us for an interview session with Officer Gunter, and we learned lots of details about the important work of police officers.

Science: As we continue our living and non-living unit, our first graders explored the life of earthworms, and our second graders learned about the ladybug.
