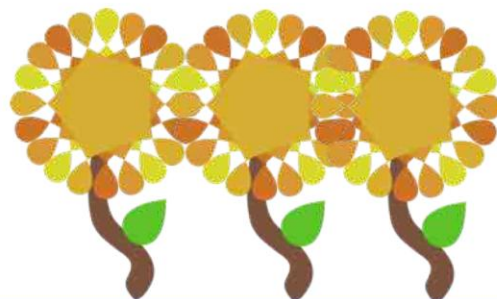

A Peek At Our Week

We have had another wonderful week with our awesome students! We will be working on MClass testing for the next few weeks, so please try to have your student present and on time each day. Of course, if your child is sick, we do not expect him/her to attend school.

Reading: This week we used the text *What If Everybody Did That* to learn about being safe, responsible, and being kind to others. When we read *The Girl Who Never Made Mistakes*, we learned that it is okay to make mistakes because we can learn from them.

Math: We have worked on stretching our brains daily with specific numbers. Ask your child to tell you about his/her thinking. We began guided math groups today. Our first graders worked on finding hidden (embedded) numbers to help us create number bonds. Our second graders counted the tens way and composed and decomposed to make the next ten. We really challenged ourselves and went all the way to 800!

Social Studies: We learned about communities, citizens (ask your student what the definition of a citizen is), rules, and laws. We earned about the Kindness Rocks project, and we are focusing on the importance of spreading kindness.
